



City of Superior Adopt-a-Stormdrain Program
Inspection Form

Stormdrain Maintenance Guidelines:

- a) Wear provided volunteer t-shirt or bright colors.
- b) We **recommend** for you to clean stormdrains weekly, and before and after storm events.
- c) Clean during daylight and do not clean stormdrain(s) when cars are present.
- d) Clean gutter 5 feet on either side of stormdrain.
- e) Clean from curbside for safety. Sweep debris from curb towards road.
- f) Using a shovel, remove overgrown vegetation within 1-2 feet of stormdrain.
- g) Collect and put trash in garbage or plastic in recycling. If you have a compost, collect leaves and grass to add compost.
- h) Hazardous materials (i.e. syringes) can be placed in hazardous material containers provided. Consider using tweezers or pliers to avoid accidental needle sticks. For removal, you can also call the Superior Fire Department at (715) 394-0227. After hours, contact 911.
- i) To remove dead animals, call Public Works at (715) 395-7334. After hours, contact 911.
- j) Inspection form: fill out online or print off. Complete form during each inspection and submit online or mail in.

- 1. Storm drain condition (infrastructure):
 - a. Good (sturdy and well maintained)
 - b. Fair (some erosion around drain, infrastructure/cement shows some signs of wear)
 - c. Poor (highly eroded around drain, metal broken or cracked, infrastructure is damaged)
- 2. Storm drain blockage (litter/debris):
 - a. Minimal (0-19% covered with litter/debris)
 - b. Partial (20-39% covered with litter/debris)
 - c. Significant (40-79% covered with litter/debris)
 - d. Blocked (80-100% covered with litter/debris)
- 3. Items found on or around storm drain (Do NOT attempt to remove items inside the structure):
 - a. Grass clippings or leaves
 - b. Sand and sediment
 - c. Litter
 - i. Plastic bottles
 - ii. Aluminum cans
 - iii. Glass bottles
 - iv. Food wrappers
 - v. Plastic bags
 - vi. Cigarette butts



- vii. Plastic pieces smaller than 2 cm
 - viii. Sharps
