SUBPART D. - MUNICIPAL FOREST PROTECTION*

| Sec. 1. - Title and intent.

- (a) This ordinance shall be called the "Municipal Forest Protection Charter Ordinance."
- (b) The intent of this ordinance is to set aside and preserve for recreational and education activities and facilities, open for the participation and enjoyment of all citizens, the land and natural resources identified as the Superior Municipal Forest. To protect this goal it is the intent of the ordinance to exclude conflicting activities and uses.

| Sec. 2. - [Prohibited activities].

- (a) No person shall engage in any of the following activities within the municipal forest:
 - (1) Depositing any debris, garbage, rock, sand, soil or other materials;
 - (2) Moving or removing sand, soil, clay, rock, or gravel; and
 - (3) Constructing any structure for use industrial, commercial, or residential use.
- (b) The prohibitions set forth in subparagraph (a) shall not be construed to prohibit any of the following activities:
 - (1) Use or maintenance of existing roads for public recreational purposes;
 - (2) Construction and maintenance of trails for public recreation purposes;
 - (3) Construction and maintenance of an environmental learning center;
 - (4) Construction and maintenance of a facility to be used as a warming house and/or ski chalet and to house equipment for maintaining the municipal forest, roads and structures located within the municipal forest; and
 - (5) Development and maintenance of wetland mitigation areas within the meaning of the special area management plan; and
 - (6) Construction and maintenance of two graded and graveled public parking areas to provide access for forest users, specifically:
 - (a) Six spaces at the Millennium Trail's west end; and
 - (b) Twelve spaces at the ice fisherman's entry off Badger Drive.

| Sec. 3. - [Municipal forest defined].

For purpose of this Charter Ordinance, the "municipal forest" shall be all those lands owned by the City of Superior which are located in Section 4, 5 and 6 of Township 48, North of Range 14 West; Sections 19, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33 of Township 49, North of Range 14 West; and the West half of Southwest Quarter (W 1/2 SW 1/4) of Section 20, Township 49, North of Range 14 West, Douglas County, Wisconsin, described in the Superior, Wisconsin, Ordinance No. 2252, § 1, April 4, 1984.

| Sec. 4. - [Conveyance prohibited].

The City of Superior shall not convey any interest in any lands currently owned which are designated

municipal forest.

| Sec. 5. - [Enforcement].

The director of public works, the park administrator, city forester or any law enforcement officer may issue citations in accordance with section 1-14 of the Code of Ordinances for the enforcement of this subpart.
